The Reverend Wallace Schulz coming to Redeemer: The Rev. Wallace Schulz is our special guest preacher today here at Redeemer Lutheran. Rev. Schulz served as associate Lutheran Hour speaker from 1977 to 2002. Before becoming associate speaker for The Lutheran Hour, Rev. 
