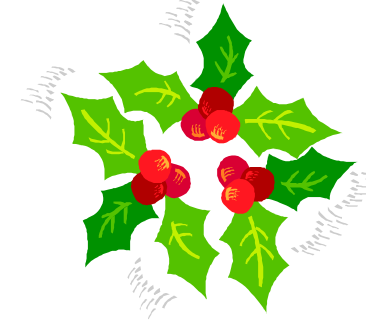

Lighting of the Advent Candle

Last Sunday we lit the third candle, the rose colored candle—the candle of joy. Today we light the fourth candle, the candle of hope. At the far end of the road, of life and of the world, Christ has promised many exciting things: the angels to carry us to glory, the guarantee of the end, the time of judgment, the splendor of the throne room, the glory of the mansions, are just some of them. God has made His monumental promises of mighty blessings in store for us. There they stand, these promises, and the pictures they suggest. God has planted ‘hope for them into the hearts of His people. They are apprehended by faith. Faith reaches and grasps not only the Christ, but the hope of standing in the presence of the Father with Him. Hope sustains God’s people. In hope they have overcome persecution and martyrdom. In hope they have triumphed over the long valley of tears. In hope they have laid loved ones in the dust of the earth to wait for that great and glorious Day of the Lord in the resurrection. Hope is one of our Lord’s tremendous gifts to us, for His implanted hope must, by the sheer reality of God, be a realized hope. Faith and hope are in a common bond. ‘Faith’ writes the author to the Hebrews, ‘Faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen’ (Hebrews 11:1). Christmas and the birth of our Lord open the whole great scope of faith and hope, promise and resolution laid before us by our loving God. It is fitting that one candle be labeled and symbolize hope!

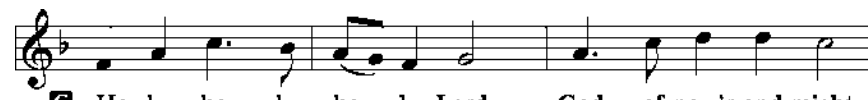
