


## A Five-Year Check-Up

It hardly seems possible but this October will mark the fifth anniversary of my Installation as your Pastor here at Redeemer. If I recall correctly, it was right around August 2002 when I reached the decision to accept the Call to come to Redeemer. When I stop to think about all that has happened—and changed—during the past five years it is both overwhelming and deeply humbling. I am reminded (and not so gently!) of how little control I, or any of us has, over LIFE. At the same time I am immensely encouraged as I recall that we are all in the hands of the One who IS in control.

I'd like to take this opportunity to focus on a few bright spots—and a few challenges—that are approaching on our horizon. First of all, the bright spots:

Our Redeemer Long Range Planning Committee is continuing to work with all of our Congregational Officers and Board Directors in developing a 10-year Vision for Redeemer Lutheran Church and Child Care. Each Board is then responsible for formulating an "action plan" for the role it will play in helping to make the vision a reality. All of this is the continuation of the Long Range Planning Retreat which was held in the summer of 2006. As I'm sure you can appreciate, boiling down vague ideas into nuts-and-bolts action plans takes time—and a lot of work. Please keep Dr. Bud Harty and the Committee in your prayers as they continue to provide leadership in this very important endeavor.

Before I shift our focus away from Long Range Planning I think a footnote is in order. As we all know, things aren't "booming" like they were back in 2002. Hurricanes, taxes, insurance, and advancing years have depleted the vitality of our area...and of our congregation. In the past few years scores of people from our Redeemer family have moved out of the area. A glance at the local economy and housing market shows that we aren't the only ones who have experienced such setbacks. At the same time, however, corporations like Wal-mart and Home Depot have invested heavily in our area because they believe that Charlotte County will soon be "booming" once again. The "Baby Boomers" have just started hitting retirement age and there is every reason to believe that a good portion of them will end up here. If God wills that such projections hold true will Redeemer be ready...to respond in ministry...to receive and integrate new members...to reach out to the hurting and spiritually lost among that wave of new people?

That's why – even while we are currently in a type of "hang-in-there mode" (and the discouragement that goes with it) – it is vitally important to pursue our Long Range Plan. If you think of the people who will be led to our area as molten metal, then our Long Range Plan is the "mold" which needs to be ready and in place in order to shape our ministry as they come. Even if you or I might no longer be here in 2016, may it be our prayer that Redeemer will be poised to be a powerful instrument in our Savior's Kingdom! (Whew—that's quite a footnote!)

The second “bright spot” I want to mention is our Redeemer Child Care. I don’t think too many of us can fully grasp how far Shawn Richard and Shirley Byrne helped our Child Care to develop over the past 10 years. There were more headaches and hiccups than anyone could have foreseen. The fact remains that Redeemer Child Care now has a fully equipped physical facility, capable of ministering to well over 100 children each day.

We have also been blessed with an energetic and enthusiastic new Director, Brandy Bilhardt. She is already grabbing hold of the reins to help raise our Child Care to the next level in excellence.

Finally, the School Board (which governs our Child Care) has been completely reconfigured. More than three-quarters of our Church Council members are now set to play an active role in the support and supervision of Redeemer Child Care. I am praying that this will usher in a new era of interaction between our Child Care and our overall ministry as a congregation.

Now let me shift our focus to a few challenges:

The most critical challenge that I see on our horizon is really not on our horizon; it’s right on our doorstep. It is time for every able-bodied (or even not-so-able-bodied) member of our congregation to take on an active service role. We have a dedicated “core group” of workers who have been carrying the burden of responsibility for the entire congregation. That can’t go on! Please note that I am not asking for ‘VOLUNTEERS’. A “volunteer” is someone who decides whether or not he will be a worker. If you are a Christian that decision has already been made for you ... by your Lord. When Jesus calls us to faith He also calls us to service.

As part of my personal/pastoral five-year review I’ve been looking over our church membership roster. Obviously our church family has a significant number of members who are no longer physically capable of hands-on service. If you are one of these please remember how powerful and vital your prayers can be! Pray for me...for our church leaders and workers...for our Child Care Director and Staff. Pray that God will change the hearts of those who could help but aren’t. Pray that God will bring into our midst new workers in His harvest field. Pray that we will be able to reach out in a winsome way to our community.

My review of our church roles also turned up 29 different families/individuals who (to the best of my *limited* knowledge) could very well serve in a variety of ways. But, as far as I know, do not. That is not an accusation (I don’t claim to know what is going on in other people’s lives) but it is a challenge. It’s something we all need to talk to our Lord about—and then listen as He talks to us in His Word. What would HE say to us if we try to tell Him we can’t serve Him because: “I’m too busy” ... “I’m retired” ... “I’ve already had my turn” ... “I did that back home”???

In all frankness I have to say that every person who IS currently filling a role of responsibility at Redeemer could have just as easily responded with those kinds of statements—with that kind of attitude. But thank God they responded by saying, “Here am I ... send me!”

If you are interested in serving in any of these areas I urge you to call me as soon as you finish reading this.

I also urge everyone who reads this to pray (*right now—I'll wait!!!*) that God will move many to serve gladly and willingly in these—and countless other ways ... and pray that His name would be glorified (and our joy multiplied) as we watch those prayers being answered.

# President's Corner

The Church Council and I thank you for your continued prayers and support. We thank God daily for all the blessings he showers on us.

In our last newsletter you may recall that I wrote about that we as members of Redeemer are equal share holders in carrying out the mission that the Lord has for our congregation. This means of course that we have equal ownership in the mission of what we call Redeemer Lutheran Church.

As equal shareholders we are expected to support the mission of Redeemer based on the talents and treasures that He first gave to us; however, we have a free will in how we choose to use these gifts. We can exercise the right to use the talents and gifts or we can even forfeit this right by not using the gifts that each of us has been blessed.

When I think of ownership I also think of pride in ownership. When you own something that has some importance to you, are you not proud of that possession? I am sorry for all the questions, but I sense that unfortunately some of us that call Redeemer our church home have not considered our individual role in the mission of our congregation; therefore, we have deprived ourselves of the opportunity to use those gifts HE first gave us. What happens when we deprive ourselves of those opportunities? Unfortunately just about everything has a cost. So what is the cost here? First, there is a personal cost. Not knowing the joy of being an active instrument in the work of the congregation and with that comes the loss of ownership and the pride in the ownership. Secondly, there is the possibility that function or task might not be done and that opportunity which could possibly have lead to reach additional souls might be lost forever. Now that is an awesome cost.

Ours is an urgent business. Everyday is the last day for someone. Our task is to reach everyone we can with the GOOD NEWS and to be effective each part of the Body, **THAT IS ALL OF US**, have to take our rightful share in ownership based on the gifts and talents by which we were blessed.

# Stewardship



The Lutheran Church Missouri Synod encourages the study of the biblical Stewardship Principles developed by the Department of Stewardship several years ago. Your Board Stewardship is presenting in the next several monthly newsletters one of these eight principles. We hope you take the time to read and study these, and that you find them helpful. One of the Stewardship Principles follows:

## GOD'S STEWARDS ARE LOVED AND LOVING

What does this mean:

God's stewards recognize that their stewardship flows out of God's act of love for them in Christ which empowers them, in turn, to love others in acts of Christ-like love.

What does God's Word say about this?

1 John 4:19 We love because he first loved us. (cf. 1 John 4:11).

1 John 3:16-18 This is how we know what love is: Jesus Christ laid down his life for us. And we ought to lay down our lives for our brothers. If anyone has material possessions and sees his brother in need but has no pity on him, how can the love of God be in him? Dear children, let us not love with words or tongue but with actions and in truth.

John 13:34-35 A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this all men will know you are my disciples, if you love one another.

2 Cor. 5:14-15 For Christ's love compels us, because we are convinced that one died for all, and therefore all have died. And he dies for all, that those who live should no longer live for themselves but for him who died for them and was raised again.

Gal. 5:6b That only thing that counts is faith expressing itself through love.

How is this done?

As children of God through faith in Jesus Christ, and with the Holy Spirit's help, we will:

- Emphasize that all activities of Christian stewards done in faith and love are properly Christian stewardship;
- Honor the choices God's people make as they exercise Christ-like love; and,
- Use only those approaches, strategies and methods that reflect the Gospel and build up the stewards' faith active in love.


As children of God through faith in Jesus Christ, and with the Holy Spirit's help, we will not:

- Employ techniques and fundraising methods that fail to emphasize God's love in Christ as the basis and motivation for Christian stewardship;
- Minimize the bringing of regular offerings as a part of worship and a loving response to God's love for us; or,
- De-emphasize or set aside God's love and our response in order to meet budgets, quotas, and goals.

# Long Range Planning

## Looking Into the Crystal Ball

By 2017, Redeemer Lutheran Church and Child Care is a unified, community church which fully integrates year-round and seasonal members of all ages. Membership, which is very attractive to community residents, has increased steadily, with new member numbers exceeding losses. We have 600 active, full-time members, 300 associate members, and regularly-attending non-members.

Our purpose is to extend and nurture the Church of Jesus Christ by preaching and teaching the Word of God, by administering the sacraments, and by fostering Christian fellowship, all according to the confessional standards of the LCMS.

The church is financially sound with excess funds going to the endowment fund for future growth and maintenance needs. The members are 'mature Christian' stewards who understand the value of Christian stewardship principles, and who lovingly give of time, talent and treasures. All boards are fully staffed, we have no problem getting workers. A large number of our member have committed to tithing.

We have expanded and added to our ministries, offering more services to the community, including a K-8 Christian day school and a regional (circuit) high school. We have an active youth ministry and a strong elder ministry, which includes a Redeemer adult day care center and a regional (Circuit) assisted living facility (ALF). The people of Englewood know Redeemer to be a loving, caring, growing family of believers.

As a result of our growth, we will have physically expanded the church building, adding more seats and building additions to support our worship activities (music, kitchen, sound system, audio visual equipment, etc.) The Fellowship Hall would be expanded or replaced, insuring adequate facilities for social activities, dinners, offices, lounge areas, showers, etc. A new Christian day school will be constructed on the premises. Additional land may have to be acquired.

This banner not only advertised VBS, but also Redeemer Lutheran Church and Child Care. Notices were also placed on local radio stations and in the three local newspapers. We got a lot of coverage. Our Youth and Sunday School kids put out door knob invitations on houses in our neighborhood. Many thanks also to our members who placed door knob invites on houses. Many new children came to VBS as a result of these efforts. SEE WHAT WE CAN DO WHEN WE ALL GET INVOLVED. Thanks to all who helped spread this good news.

## New Tract Rack

Please check out the new Tract Rack in the Narthex, near the refreshment table. We have a lot of new tracts—take as many as you'd like. - **Library:** Borrow a book, return it within a reasonable time.


This is an honor system so you don't need to check in with anyone.

# Footprints IN THE SAND



Try this craft at the beach, at the park or in your own sandbox at home. It will remind you whose footprints we should follow.

### What you need:

- Plaster of Paris
- Sand (beach, park or sandbox)
- Small shells (optional)
- Water
- Small bowl
- Stick, toothpick or skewer (optional)



### What you do:

1. Find some moist sand by digging down a little.
2. With a bare foot, make a footprint in the sand.
3. (Optional) Place shells face down on the toe imprints as toenails.
4. Follow the plaster of Paris directions for mixing the dry plaster with water in bowl.
5. Fill the footprint with the plaster and smooth the surface.
6. (Optional) Using a stick, toothpick or skewer, write "Direct my footsteps" (Psalm 119:133) or "Follow Me" (John 10:27).
7. When dry, place the foot in your garden, yard or room.
8. Remember to turn the foot over to remind yourself of whose footprints we should follow, and that we are never alone.



## Unique Creations


Have you ever walked along the shore and noticed the footprints you make in the sand? A famous poem called "Footprints in the Sand" reminds us we are never alone.
