How the scripture readings are relevant to you today: “*Christ, our Passover lamb, has been sacrificed*” (1 Cor. 5:7). By the shed blood of Christ, the Lamb of God, eternal death has passed over us. The stone has been rolled away from the tomb, revealing that the tomb could not hold Him (Mark 16:1–8).
