

Giving Thanks

November is the time we really focus on giving thanks to God for all of His blessings – material and especially spiritual. However we need to remember that giving thanks should not be once a year focus, but an every day of the year focus. God through Paul reminds us of this when Paul, as he is writing his letter to the people of Thessalonica, says this: 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18:

¹⁶ Rejoice always, ¹⁷ pray continually, ¹⁸ give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus.

Paul planted the church in Thessalonica on his second missionary trip through Asia Minor (now known as Turkey), and then on to Greece from 50-52 AD. His first stop was Philippi (Acts 16:11-40), then Thessalonica (Acts 17:1-9). Paul then goes to Berea (Acts 17:10-15), then off to Athens (Acts 17:16-34). After Athens, Paul moves on to Corinth (Acts 18:1-18).

Paul's work in Thessalonica was fruitful, but also created a disturbance so upsetting that many of the believers felt it was necessary to send Paul and Silas to Berea for their safety. I encourage you to read about Paul's stay in Berea (Acts 17:10-15) as it explains why he moves on and I also believe, lays the ground work for the letter that he will eventually write to the believers in Thessalonica while he is staying in Corinth.

This is what the <u>Concordia Study Bible</u> says regarding the purpose for writing the first letter to the believers in Thessalonica.

Believers in God's grace came under physical attack at Thessalonica. One of the main reasons for writing 1 Thessalonians may be summarized in a single word – persecution. Paul came to Thessalonica after suffering persecution (beating and imprisonment) at Philippi (2:2). He was forced to leave Thessalonica as a result of persecution. Even then persecution continued from the Jews at Thessalonica, who followed Paul to Berea and stirred up antagonism

there (Acts 17:10-13). Because Paul knew that persecution continued to be a problem at Thessalonica, he sent Timothey to find out what the situation was there (3:1-5) – how the believers in God's grace were withstanding persecution.

Paul writes to encourage these Christians to remain steadfast in the face of such persecution by taking comfort and hope in God's grace.

Knowing this, the statement regarding giving thanks in all circumstances makes sense. Paul is encouraging the Thessalonian believers – who are experiencing pressure – AKA – persecution – from the Jews to give thanks even during these difficult times. Of course, the thanks isn't because they are experiencing persecution, but thanks that even in persecution (difficult times) God has not and will not forsake them. God has been and will continue to be with them.

Someone has said that God has not promised to calm and quiet every storm of life that we experience, but He will always be with us in the darkness and ferocity of the storm.

Every day in my personal devotions, I take time to write down my Thankfulness/Gratitude list and it always begins with the relationship I have with God. It goes like this:

I thank you God:

For your pardon, patience, peace, presence, protection, provision, mercy, grace, faithfulness and blessings.

I call this my P⁶ list.

After this, I then go on to list the other items for which I am thankful.

I may not feel or realize how God fulfills each of these P^6 items every day, but I believe and trust He fulfills these each and every day because of His love for me. I don't have to have a cognitive awareness of how God revealed each of the P^6 list in my life each day. In the four years that I have been doing the gratitude list as part of my daily devotional routing, I have grown to realize and trust that God does fulfill each P^6 and the entire gratitude list every day of my life, for which I am grateful.

His temporal gifts are blessings to and for us, and bring blessing upon us even as they are pressed into His service for His kingdom and the souls that receive them.

Thus we place all that we have into God's hands. He never fails to remember us and pours out the fullness of His promises upon us. We give thanks for all that He has done, is doing and will continue to do. We give thanks by not taking for ourselves, but giving to all even as our heavenly Father has given to us.

As we prepare for Thanksgiving celebrations, may we all give thanks continually for all that we are and all that we have because of God's providential care. And may we be all the more diligent in bringing everything that we have received from God to Him, so that He may bless it and employ it for the good of all — even for us. For to the one who has, more will be given, and he will have an abundance.



Understanding God's Word often means looking at it from a fresh perspective – getting "the big picture" as well as the important details. Exploring God's Word includes 12 individual sessions, maps, charts, a glossary, and a section of intriguing Bible facts. Exploring God's Word helps you gain a broader understanding of what the Bible means when viewed as a whole – not simply as a collection of individual books.

Table Talk: Table talk is a very informal Bible study now held on Thursday mornings at 9:30 AM, immediately after the 8:45 school chapel service. Participants come with any sort of question. We work to answer those questions from God's Word and from our Lutheran Confessions. In doing that we all learn more about God's Word and its application in our lives. 
