Your Past Does Not Define Your Future

New Year's is a celebration of the past and the future. We take stock of the past with thanksgiving and sometimes even relief (that it's over), and we look to the future in hope and anticipation, and perhaps with some worry, for what it holds.

The point is that New Year's celebrations remind us of who we are as opposed to who we would like to be, what we have done in comparison to what we want to do. It reminds us of our accomplishments, but mostly it reminds us of our failures. What we've lost. Who we've lost.

New Year's is our own version of Charles Dickens' classic, *A Christmas Carol*. And we all play Scrooge. We are visited by the ghosts of our pasts, presents and futures.

St. Paul writes: "The point is this: whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that having all sufficiency in all things at all times, you may abound in every good work. As it is written, 'He has distributed freely, he has given to the poor; his righteousness endures forever.' He who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will supply and multiply your seed for sowing and increase the harvest of your righteousness. You will be enriched in every way for all your generosity, which through us will produce thanksgiving to God" (2 Cor. 9:6–15).

St. Paul tells us that the Lord will both supply and increase what we need to give to the church for its work in the world. He tells us that this work God does in us will enrich and bless us in every way, and through this, will produce thanksgiving to God. With this in mind, here is some practical advice to help you take stock of your giving in years past and change what needs to be adjusted, improved, or done away with altogether.

First, attend the Divine Service to receive God's gifts of forgiveness, life and salvation. If you've not been faithful in attending worship to hear the preaching of God's Word, to receive forgiveness and feast on the rich food of our Lord's body and blood for the eternal benefit of your body and soul, then repent and come to receive the gifts God freely gives. God doesn't want your money. He wants you — all of you (Matt. 22:20–22).

Second, pray for the Lord's help. Your right as a Christian is to speak with your Father, the King of all creation, freely through His Son, our Lord, Jesus Christ. Go to the throne of grace and ask for strength and wisdom to follow His bidding faithfully (John 15:1–16).

Third, consider what the church is and what the church does. The church is a place of mercy. It inhales the mercy of the Father by the death, resurrection and ascension of His Son through the preaching of the Gospel and the Sacraments. It exhales this mercy in love toward neighbors. You are a member of the church, of God's family. Thus, you are not only a recipient of God's mercy, but a bearer of that mercy for the life of the world. You spread that mercy through the generous giving of your income to support the work of the church in the world, as the Israelites did in the Old Testament (Lev. 27:1–34).

Fourth, take stock of your current giving in light of the New Testament's teaching on supporting

the work of the church. Are you giving of your first fruits, taking it out of your paycheck first, or does God get what's left over? Are you giving voluntarily and cheerfully? Are you giving proportionally and generously? The Old Testament required a tithe, or ten percent. The New Testament gives freedom to be generous, to give more for the Church's work. Are you relying on God's promise to provide and increase what you need to do His work? If your answer is no to any of these, repent. If God gave you His only Son, will He not provide for you all things, even physical things? Trust Him, His Word, and heed it.

So, don't let your past define your future. Rather, commit for the year a generous proportion of your income, which is God's gift to you for this body and life.



Description below is from the CPH website:

Understanding God's Word often means looking at it from a fresh perspective – getting "the big picture" as well as the important details. Exploring God's Word includes 12 individual sessions, maps, charts, a glossary, and a section of intriguing Bible facts. Exploring God's Word helps you gain a broader understanding of what the Bible means when viewed as a whole – not simply as a collection of individual books.

Table Talk: Table talk is a very informal Bible study now held on Thursday mornings at 9:30 AM, immediately after the 8:45 school chapel service. Participants come with any sort of question. We work to answer those questions from God's Word and from our Lutheran Confessions. In doing that we all learn more about God's Word and its application in our lives. December Day School Update

For the month of December, Miss Pam and Miss Nicole made a life size gingerbread house for their room for the kids to decorate and play in. The kids loved it!

Kindergarten and 1st grade have been working on their Phonemic Awareness skills. They work daily on their phonemic awareness lessons to make them better readers. They learn how to blend sounds together as well as chop words apart. They take part of a word and change it to another sound to make a new word. For example, if Miss Nicole says, "My word is 'puck' change the 'p' to a 'd' what is my new word?" They are also learning to rhyme words and delete phonemes. They are well on their way to becoming excellent readers!

Second grade history class is learning how America grew quickly. They learned about how America is considered the land of milk and honey. They also learned how immigrants had dreams of being free to worship God, of finding a good job, of the importance that children get a good education, and of owning your own home. Second grade has also learned the importance of a good work ethic and how it's important to always do the right thing even when no one is looking. Psalms 128:1 Blessed is every one that fears the Lord; that walks in His ways.

Third graders helped the kindergarteners learn the Christmas Carols for the Christmas program. Singing the verses to the kindergarteners really helped everyone sing well. In History, 3rd grade learned about Patrick Henry and his quote," Give me liberty or give me death!" He wanted the government to serve the people instead of controlling them. He demanded the Bill of Rights be added to the Constitution so that each citizen would have the freedoms they had fought for. The first Bill of Rights states that Congress cannot make laws to take away the freedom of religion. In Science, they made a daily weather chart and plotted the chart to see how the temperature changes. In Language, the students have been writing declarative, imperative, exclamatory and interrogative sentences in their journals. They are using correct punctuation marks for each kind of sentence.

In Bible, 3rd grade has learned about absolution, that our Lord is always loving and forgiving. When we tell others we are sorry for doing something wrong we can be loving like Jesus and tell them we forgive them.

The 4th, 5th and 6th grades have been studying Spanish two days a week. They just finished a test on colors, numbers ABC's, months, days and the verbs estar and tener. They love studying Spanish with songs! In Bible Class they have been studying the Major and Minor Prophets. They have been discussing how Isaiah foretold the coming of the Messiah. They also learned about the relationship between the writings of Jeremiah and how Lamentations followed based on the exile of Israel.

The 6th graders have been learning about Business Math. They have been working on calculating percentages and learning how to apply them to the retail industry. They are figuring how to apply percentages in calculating cost reduction.

It's been a busy December! We had our Christmas program with the Day School, VPK and After School. Everyone worked hard on this program and it was absolutely adorable! Students and staff are looking forward to the upcoming winter break!

Dear Jesus, I love to hear the story of Your birth. Glory to God! You came to be my Savior. Amen.


