Pastoral Call Process

On Sunday, May 21, 2023, in the pre-service announcements, I let those in attendance know that my role as Vacancy Pastor here at Redeemer potentially will be changing on July 1st if the Voter's Assembly called for in June approves the proposal/contract that I have submitted.

When I became your Vacancy Pastor on September 11, 2022, I also began training two weeks later for a pastoral ministry role endorsed by the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod called *Intentional Interim Ministry*. My training for that role was completed April 21, 2023.

Intentional Interim Ministry trains Pastors for the specialized task of guiding and leading congregations through the transition

between Pastors with the express purpose of helping them deal with the emotional issues and/ or conflicts that arose when the former pastor left, resigned or died, in order to help them be prepared to welcome the new Pastor that God will bring to them.

For a variety of reasons, the current leadership of Redeemer, along with agreement from the leadership of the FL-GA District, agreed that it would be beneficial for Redeemer if my role shifted from that of Vacancy Pastor to Intentional Interim Pastor.

A proposal/contract is being submitted for approval by the Voter's Body at the June congregational meeting. This proposal, when approved by the congregation, will also be signed by the appropriate FL-GA District officials.

The following lists some of the items mentioned in the proposal/contract.

- The amount of time I am spending at Redeemer will increase to 80% of full time.
- ♦ The length of the proposal/contract will be for 1 year.
 - There is a clause that says that upon mutual agreement the proposal/contract can be either shortened or extended depending on circumstances.
- ♦ I will not and cannot be considered as a candidate for the Pastoral position at Redeemer.

The following items are goals that I believe need to be addressed at Redeemer in order to be prepared for the next Pastor.

Goal 1: To conduct an assessment of the individual members of Redeemer regarding their views of:

♦ The overall spiritual, financial and relational health of the congregation

- The validity of the current Mission/Vision for Redeemer
- Their perception of the future Mission/Vision for Redeemer

Goal 2: To work with a market feasibility and management study group regarding the school and how the study's findings impact the current and future Mission/Vision Statement for Redeemer.

Goal 3: To work with Redeemer to help the fellowship deal with its grief regarding

- ♦ the sudden resignation of the former Pastor,
- ♦ the impact and changes brought about by Hurricane Ian,
- the resignation of many key leaders of the congregation since the new year by conducting a Bible study on the topic of grief.

Goal 4: To address the current culture of the congregation regarding interpersonal relationships in the fellowship using resources from the Ministry of Reconciliation.

Goal 5: To encourage more involvement in the life and leadership of the congregation by leading the membership into an understanding of what it means to be a disciple of Jesus through sermons and Bible study.

Goal 6: To help the members explore their role in the body of Christ as a member of Redeemer and how they can use their gifts, talents, and skills in order to strengthen the fellowship and accomplish their joint Mission/Vision by using:

- Spiritual Gifts Assessment
- ♦ DISC Inventory

Goal 7: To work on updating the Constitution/By-Laws of Redeemer to better reflect the current size of the congregation as well as allowing it to be functional during the future growth of Redeemer.

I will be needing help prioritizing these goals as well as working on Goal #1 and I am looking for at least three (3) people to assist me in that process. (Currently not in a position of leadership at Redeemer). Because of Goal #1, the people who serve should also be those who can keep confidences.

This process is going to take work. It's going to take all hands on deck. People to help plan, implement, and most of all participate in the process of study and assessment. With that work, I know we will see and experience God's blessings.

What Do You Want?

One of the best-known and most-beloved psalms is Psalm 23, the "Shepherd Psalm." There we learn that the Lord is our Shepherd. And since He is our Shepherd, we will not want. We will not suffer want because the Lord, our Shepherd, will lead us to green pastures and beside still waters. In other words, the Lord, our Shepherd, will provide for all that we need in both body and soul.

Yet, we live as though this is not the case. We live as though we *actually* suffer from want, that the Lord, our Shepherd, will not provide for all that we need. And thus, we live as though the Lord is not our Shepherd. And that means that we live as though we are not the Lord's sheep.

When do we live as though the Lord is not our Shepherd? When we put anything else before Him and His provision for us. When we think that going to work is more important than receiving His gifts in church on Sunday (in violation of the First and Third Commandments). When we fail to give generously of the first fruits of what the Lord has provided for us because we don't know what the future will bring (even though He has promised that He will lead us to green pastures and still waters).

We live as though we are not the Lord's sheep when we think that the Lord is only in the business of helping those who will help themselves. We act this way because our minds are set on earthly, temporal things and not on heavenly, eternal things. We act this way because we have stopped hearing the call of our Shepherd, which comes through His Word.

Through the Word of God, the Shepherd calls us to Himself. Through the Word, the Holy Spirit gathers and enlightens us with His gifts. Through the Word, we are kept holy and nourished in the one true faith, the faith that follows our Shepherd wherever He leads us. He promises to lead us to our true home, to the land flowing with milk and honey, to a better country, not of this world, but a heavenly one.

And so, here's the Good News: the Lord is your Shepherd, even and especially for wayward sheep. For Jesus seeks and saves those who are lost. He finds the lost sheep and carries them back to the fold. He is the Shepherd who lays down His life for His sheep. The Lord is your Shepherd. Let us live as His sheep.

Understanding God's Word often means looking at it from a fresh perspective – getting "the big picture" as well as the important details. Exploring God's Word includes 12 individual sessions, maps, charts, a glossary, and a section of intriguing Bible facts. Exploring God's Word helps you gain a broader understanding of what the Bible means when viewed as a whole – not simply as a collection of individual books.

Table Talk: Table talk is a very informal Bible study now held on Thursday mornings at 9:30 AM, immediately after the 8:45 school chapel service. Participants come with any sort of question. We work to answer those questions from God's Word and from our Lutheran Confessions. In doing that we all learn more about God's Word and its application in our lives. 
