REDEEMER – MOVING FORWARD

Pastor Ferrier has just resigned. He has left the area. Our Pastor is gone! He's gone. Why? Is it something we have done? Is it something we should have done? We are a church without a Pastor. What are we supposed to do now? What will happen to us now? Can we get another Pastor? How soon can we start looking for a Pastor? Will our worship services continue? What changes are coming?

Dear Redeemer family! These are just a few examples of the thoughts that are going through all of our minds. We are not the first congregation to experience anxiety over a Pastor leaving under unfavorable circumstances, nor will we be the last. Our dearly beloved Lutheran Church Missouri Synod has struggled with our kind of situation over the years – and has done something about it by creating the Intentional Interim Ministry Program. I have been trained in this program and when your leaders first asked me to serve, I committed to stay with you until you have successfully called a new Pastor and he is in place and functioning.

Studies over the years have shown that whenever a Pastor leaves, at least three attitudes are present in the congregation. First is the attitude of love for the Pastor. Those who love the Pastor are devastated that he is leaving. They are in grief and may have the feeling that no Pastor can ever be as good as the departing one. The energy level for those with this attitude is very low. Those who love the Pastor see very clearly the threat of pastoral change.

A second attitude is that of rejoicing that the Pastor is going. They may have had complaints about the Pastor. This attitude is a source of energy. People who are glad to see the Pastor go are ready to serve the church and move it forward. They are eager for a Pastoral Call Committee to go into action and to start moving toward the future. They often don't understand the feelings of grief that others may be expressing.

The third attitude in the congregation is that of confusion. People with this attitude do not understand why the Pastor is leaving. This attitude represents a fair number of people in any church. They do not know what is going on.

Some people will feel a mixture of all three attitudes. Emotions, expressed or not, may include grief, anger, hostility to others, abandonment, guilt, fear, anxiety and others. In some cases, individuals and families have left the church at various times before the actual Pastoral resignation.

Interim Ministry involves helping people share their feelings, hopes and fears with each other so they can come together with a spirit of excitement about the future with a

new Pastor. My being here before the Pastor's resignation has served to shorten the time required for the process of

healing that must take place. When I refer to healing, be assured that this can only come from our gracious God in His time. But we are all familiar with the advice, based on life experience, that is given to a person who loses their spouse: "For your own good, don't make any major decisions for at least six months to a year." Dear ones, it is like that for a congregation. Everyone knows that it takes time to heal. God's Word says that "There is a time for everything, and there is a time for every event under heaven" (Ecclesiasties 3:1 NASB).

The Interim Ministry is a process designed for the primary purpose: TO HELP THE CONGREGATION PREPARE ITSELF FOR A NEW PASTOR. (I will be sharing the details at the next Elders and Council meetings). The Florida-Georgia District, President Michael and Circuit Counselor Dr. Randy Winkel, will support this process with their personal visitation and assistance.

In this Interim period we will not be standing still waiting, for all services of the church will continue. The Word will be preached and the Sacraments administered, lost sheep will be tenderly brought back home, adults and babies will be Baptized, VBS will take place, Sunday School will restart and expand, Confirmation class cranks up, Child Care will prosper, choir will rehearse, weekly Bible class will study, Ladies Guild meetings will serve, Youth group will spring up and grow, dinners and parties will abound, and new members will be sought and brought into our Redeemer family.

I came to you officially on Thursday, May 1st, which was Ascension Day and I included Jesus' Words in my sermon of May 4th, "You shall receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you shall be My witnesses..." (Acts 1:8). Then we celebrated the coming of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost when St. Peter preached and the Christian Church was born. We are witnesses of all that our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ has done. We are all called to be here in this Church to proclaim the love of God in Christ Jesus. We know the same Holy Spirit will walk with us through this to God's glory and our benefit. It's good to be <u>Moving Forward</u> together with you at Redeemer.

The big news this month is of course the resignation of Pastor Ferrier. Let's all continue to pray for Pastor and his family. This will mean that we will be reevaluating our needs The President's Corner

las far as what kind of Pastor will best suit the needs of Re-



deemer Lutheran Church. The Elders will be taking the lead once we as a congrega-Ition determine our needs. This can be a long process, but we need to be prudent In our search for a new Pastor. In the mean time we are in the caring, loving hands of Pastor Thomason, and the good Lord willing Pastor Schmidt and Lanette will be rejoining us in the fall.

News for the Church budget continues to be on the positive side, with almost a \$23,000 surplus and we continue to see giving that is greater than our monthly expenses. We may have some rough financial times ahead, but as long as we continue be good stewards of our resources we will remain in good shape.

I am afraid the news concerning the Child Care (Pre School) is not as positive. With some unexpected bus repair expenses (\$1,200.00 plus for brakes), and a significant loss in children, our income is not keeping up with our regular expenses. Your School Board is aware of the problems and is working to make the necessary changes to get things back on the right track. Charlie Vovcsko is doing a great job in a difficult situation, and is getting lots of help from Christin Wacker, and members of the School Board. On the positive side, a new scholarship program is getting started to assist some of the parents to keep their children in the Pre School, linstead of taking them to a private babysitter to save few dollars. This may help to bring back a few of our "lost sheep" or at least allow qualified parents some assis-Itance in these difficult economic times. A new curriculum is being evaluated, and the School Board is looking into a tuition reimbursement program to allow the staff to further their training. The Keypad is in place and working.

Due to a bit of a miscommunication the small group sign up sheets were a little late in getting announced and put in place, so the program has been moved back a few weeks, but should be moving forward as you read this. One group has already started and hopefully we will have several others. Call Pat at the office to sign up.

It is starting out as an eventful summer, with a new Interim Pastor, the resignation of Pastor Ferrier, starting the Call process of our new Pastor, The Pre School up and downs and few other fires thrown in to make it interesting. I can't help marvel that with all that is going on how blessed we at Redeemer is to still be going in the right direction and the hard work of so many dedicated people. I feel very positive about our Church and the way we have come together to handle these trying times. Please keep praying for your Church leaders.







The Lutheran Bible Translators

Have you started a little home repair, only to discover you didn't have the right tools? Perhaps you began to prepare a meal, then discovered you didn't have all of the ingredients.

To complete the goals we have set, we need the necessary components. Whether writing a letter, changing a tire, or constructing a house, nothing can be accomplished without the right materials and equipment.

Bringing God's Word to people in their mother tongue is no different. Those serving in translation and Scripture Use programs require all the tools we are familiar with, computers, printing materials, audio/visual equipment, reliable transportation and communications. Without these things, it would be difficult, if not impossible, to test Scripture portions, teach people to read, print and distribute Bible and educational booklets, record Scripture, or even travel from place to place.

LBT missionaries are serving in over 80 translations and Scripture Use programs worldwide. It is our goal to begin 25 new projects by 2014.

In Botswana they are recording local church choirs in the Yeyt language to promote mother tongue worship; printing key terms, local stories, and calendar in the Khwe language; training teachers in the Vute language; printing of Komba prinmers for 50 literacy classes. Countries in which LBT are working: Cameroon, Botswana, Ghana, Namibia, Nigeria, Papua New Guinea, Sierra Leone, Thailand

The Lutheran Bible Translators - LBT is one of the organization the Redeemer Ladies Guild supports.

The Fall Rally is in Sarasota at Beautiful Savior on Oct. 25th. More on this later.


